### *£100,000 to the Brathay Trust since 2006*

In 2009, The Freemasons' Grand Charity awarded £50,000 to the Brathay Trust, contributing to a bursary fund which will enable disadvantaged young people to attend activity courses at Brathay Hall in Cumbria. Each programme is individually designed to meet the development needs of the young people attending and to increase their self confidence and self esteem. Over 1,000 young people are expected to benefit.

Brathay's targeted development programmes help to improve social skills, psychological well-being, self-confidence and resilience in order to overcome the difficulties that young people face today. Brathay has a vision of a society where all children and young people have access to formal and informal education to enable them to fulfil their potential.

Brathay works with partner organisations such as schools, youth organisations, local authorities, police and other agencies, frequently as part of longer-term sustainable programmes. This helps them to help: young people in care, deaf young people, homeless young people and young people not in education, employment or training.
