£50,000 grant for Centrepoint

Youth homelessness charity Centrepoint received £50,000 from The Freemasons' Grand Charity in 2010, to assist with a project called Centrepoint Partnering. The project is enabling Centrepoint to work with smaller voluntary sector homelessness charities across the country, sharing expertise and models of working with young people who are homeless to realise Centrepoint's vision of ending youth homelessness. The Freemasons' Grand Charity originally funded the project as a pilot scheme and has in total donated £158,000 to this worthy project.

Centrepoint works with one of the UK's most disadvantaged groups – homeless young people. Not only providing them with accommodation, Centrepoint also provides these vulnerable young people the support, training and advice they need to turn their lives around by helping them develop into independent, confident adults who are able to make a positive contribution to society.

Centrepoint believes that we should live in a society where all young people realise their potential and it works to support those young people who are on a downward spiral, to give them a chance to turn their lives around and build a more fulfilling future.
